Dear Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in applying for entry to our school for 2021. Every year the school receives many applications for admission from which a small intake is selected for Year 11, and students for Years 8 to 10 are admitted from a waiting list as vacancies become available.

This application package includes three forms to be completed and returned:

1. The Department of Education's **Years 8 to 12 entry to selective high schools in 2021 Application form** which you need to complete and return.
2. North Sydney Boys High School's **Summary of School Achievements** which you need complete and return with copies of school reports and any supporting evidence of other achievements attached.
3. A **Payment Form** is included for you to complete and return with your application.

### **Application Due Date – Friday 24 July 2020**

You need to complete the enclosed forms and send them to North Sydney Boys High School by no later than **12 noon Friday 24 July 2020**, marked *Attention: Admissions Officer*. Late applications will not be accepted. You will then receive a letter acknowledging receipt of your application and a **Student Identification Form**. This form, completed and with a photograph attached and one form of ID, must be brought when you present for the examination (see below).

### **Administration Fee**

A non-refundable administration fee of **\$100.00** must be included with your application. Please make an online payment by going to the school website <https://northsydbo-h.schools.nsw.gov.au/> and clicking on the **MAKE A PAYMENT** link at the top right of the home page. Applications will not be processed without payment.

### **Selection Examination Date and Times**

A selection examination will be held for all applicants and will comprise a writing section and a mathematics section. The examinations will be held in the AF Henry Hall. You will receive a letter confirming your application and the examination details upon receipt of your completed application. For this purpose please make sure to provide an **email address** on your application.

The examination date and times are as follows:

Applicants for **Year 11 2021** report to the school hall at **9:30am Monday 31 August 2020**.

Applicants for **Year 10 2021** report to the school hall at **12:30pm Monday 31 August 2020**.

Applicants for **Year 9 2021** report to the school hall at **9:30am Tuesday 1 September 2020**.

Applicants for **Year 8 2021** report to the school hall at **12:30pm Tuesday 1 September 2020**.

### Pick Up Times

Applicants for **Year 11 2021** may be picked up from 12:00 noon on Monday 31 August 2020.

Applicants for **Year 10 2021** may be picked up from 3:00pm on Monday 31 August 2020.

Applicants for **Year 9 2021** may be picked up from 12:00 noon on Tuesday 1 September 2020.

Applicants for **Year 8 2021** may be picked up from 3:00pm on Tuesday 1 September 2020.

1. Your completed North Sydney Boys High School **Student Identification Form** with an **attached passport sized photograph** (the photograph must be a recent photo taken within the last 12 months) and one form of ID
2. Two black pens
3. A calculator (except for Year 8, 2021 students, i.e. current Year 7 students)
4. A pencil
5. An eraser
6. Bottled water, in a clear container, if you want water

### What *Not* to Bring to the Selection Test

**Do not** bring any valuables including mobile phones, iPods or other electronic devices. These valuables will not be permitted in the exam room and you will be asked to surrender such items if you bring them.

Please note, parents will not be allowed to enter the hall.

### Access to the School on Test Day

There is **no** parking for vehicles on the school grounds. Pedestrian access is available via Falcon Street. There is limited street parking. Please **do not park** on school grounds.

### Notification of Outcome of Application

You will be notified of the outcome of your application by the end of October 2020. Please do not make enquiries to the school before this date. If you are successful and receive an offer, you will be contacted by phone and email and you will need to reply to the school within 24 hours of the date of the offer.

# Application information - Years 8 to 12 entry to selective high schools in 2021

Please complete the application form if you wish to apply for your child to enter a selective high school starting in Years 8 to 12. You can apply for up to three schools. Use a separate application form for each school and send it directly to the schools.

## Important dates

<b>October-November 2020</b>	Advice about the outcome of applications is sent to parents.

The number of vacancies in Years 8 to 12 will vary across academic Years and from school to school. Generally the number of vacancies is limited. Places in Years 11 and 12 may not be available in all schools.

Before submitting your application to the chosen selective high school, you should go to each school's website and/or contact the school to find out:

- whether to send the application form by email or by mail
- the distance your child will need to travel to attend the school
- the school assessment procedures such as testing
- courses and programs offered
- selection criteria
- boarding fees and possible financial assistance for boarders
- geographical isolation factors for boarder agricultural high schools.

In this document:

'selective' includes fully selective high schools, partially selective high schools, Aurora College virtual secondary school and agricultural high schools.

'parent' is defined under the Education Act to 'include a guardian or other person having the custody or care of a child'.

# Selective high schools

Selective high schools cater for highly achieving academically gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be isolated from a suitable academic peer group. These schools can provide intellectual stimulation by grouping academically gifted and talented students together, concentrating school resources and using specialised teaching methods.

There are:

- **Seventeen** fully selective high schools where all classes are academically selective.
- **Twenty-four** high schools with selective classes (partially selective) in Years 7 and above. Partially selective high schools have community classes as well as selective classes for English, science and mathematics.
- Sydney Secondary College Leichhardt and Balmain campuses offer places in Years 7-10. These students generally proceed to Blackwattle Bay campus for Years 11 and 12.
- Alexandria Park, Rose Bay and Tempe High Schools have targeted places available for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students.
- **Four** agricultural high schools (three of which offer boarding places). Agricultural high schools are selective high schools that emphasise the study of agriculture. Boarding sections give some priority to isolated students.
- **One** virtual partially selective high school, Aurora College. For Aurora College, only students intending to enrol in a government high school in a rural or remote location are eligible to apply. A list of eligible participating schools is available at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7/information-for-applicants/aurora-college/rural-and-remote-high-schools>.

The complete list of selective high schools accepting applications for vacancies starting in Years 8 to 12 is shown at the end of this document. Please visit the schools' websites to find out whether they are taking applications for vacancies in Years 11 and 12 before applying for those school Years.

## Fees

As with all government schools, tuition at selective high schools is free, but schools may ask for a voluntary contribution to cover services such as library, textbooks and curriculum-related resources. Schools may also ask for contributions to cover the purchase of materials in certain key learning areas and to cover costs associated with sports or excursions. Boarder agricultural high schools charge boarding fees.

# Enquiries

If you have enquiries, contact the specific selective high school. Contact details are listed at the end of this document.

## How to apply

Read this document carefully.

- You may apply for no more than three selective high schools. Look up the school websites that are listed at the end of this document to find out about the assessment requirements for entry to Years 8 to 12. Courses offered may not be the same as the previous school but current courses may be taken into account by selection committees.
- Complete a separate application form for each selective high school you wish to apply for. You must list the schools you choose in the order of priority the same way on every application form.
- Attach a copy of the birth certificate or other document that verifies the student's name shown on each application.
- Send each form to the relevant selective high school by Friday 24 July 2020.
- Complete any extra forms the school asks for.

## Australian citizenship and residency status

Candidates must be Australian citizens or holders of a visa granting permanent resident status in Australia. Information on Australian citizenship is available on the Department of Immigration and Border Protection website at: <http://www.border.gov.au/Trav/Citi>

You can get a Certificate of Evidence of Australian Citizenship or a Visa grant notice to prove your visa status.

Citizens of New Zealand are eligible for selective high school entry. Permanent residents of New Zealand are considered in the same manner as temporary residents of Australia and are not normally eligible. If you do not meet these residency requirements at the time of applying but expect to meet them by the time offers are made, you are allowed to apply provided you are already living in Australia.

If you qualify for entry on academic grounds but do not meet the residency requirements, including those who hold diplomatic visas, you may ask for special consideration through the review process.

If your application is successful, you must show original documentation, such as a Certificate of Evidence of Australian Citizenship, birth certificates or visas, before the school can enrol your child.

Your child's offer may be cancelled if it is based on false or misleading information.

## Residential address

Your family must be living in NSW by the beginning of the 2021 school year. If your family normally lives in NSW but you are temporarily out of the state, you should expect to return before the student is enrolled in a selective high school. If you continue to live outside NSW after the 2021 school year begins your application will be considered only if there are vacancies remaining after all suitable applicants from NSW have been placed.

## Acknowledgement of receipt of application

Your application will be acknowledged by the school/s in writing.

## Change of application details

If there is a change in details such as your child's name, address or school after you have sent your application form, please write to the selective high school(s) you have applied for. Write to those schools directly if you want to withdraw your application.

## Selection procedures

The number of vacancies at selective high schools in Years 8 to 12 will generally depend on the number of students who leave in the previous year. In some schools there may be no vacancies in some academic Years.

For each selective high school, a selection committee will decide on the students to be offered places and will establish a reserve list in priority order on the basis of academic merit. The selection committee comprises at least two people, including the selective high school principal and a parent representative.

The selection committee may ask for further information or arrange for additional assessment procedures if required.

# Testing

If it is required by the selection committee, students may be asked to take a test. In this case, the school will provide you with reasonable notice of the time, date and place of the test. Schools may request a test administration fee.

Where testing is conducted by the school, students found to be cheating risk disqualification from the test.

## Notice of outcome

You will be notified in writing about the outcome of your application. Some later offers may be made by telephone. Students may be:

- offered a place
- put on the reserve list
- advised that they did not qualify for placement.

If your child is placed on a reserve list, it applies only to starting in the school Year you applied for. If unsuccessful you can apply in future to start in subsequent school Years.

This information will be provided by each school you applied for.

## Response to offers

If you receive an offer, please respond to the school as soon as possible. If you do not respond within 7 days or within the time specified on your offer letter, the school will assume that you do not want to accept the offer. Where your offer is made by telephone you must respond within 24 hours.

If you will be away on holidays when offers are being made, you should leave contact details with the selective school(s) or delegate someone to respond on your behalf.

If you accept the offer you will be sent an Authority to attend letter by the school. For government high school students the selective high school principal will then arrange for the student's records to be transferred.

The offer will be withdrawn if the student fails to enrol at the school at the beginning of the school year without providing a satisfactory explanation.

You must negotiate any deferment with the principal. You cannot defer enrolment beyond the first day of Term 2, 2021.

If you accept the offer then later change your mind, please tell the school immediately so that the next eligible applicant can be offered the place.

If you decline the offer, you will be sent a letter to confirm this.

## Reviews

If you wish to contest a decision of the selection committee, you should contact the school within 14 days of the date on the outcome letter with detailed reasons why you believe the selection committee's decision should be reviewed.

You can request a review if you have evidence that the stated criteria for selection were not considered or the stated process was not followed.

You should include information such as:

- factors which may have prevented the student from gaining a place
- any supporting material, where applicable. Reviews based on illness must include a medical certificate covering the date of the assessment.

Decisions cannot be reviewed if they are based on:

- other assessments such as NAPLAN or competitions
- in-class rankings of one candidate over another
- disruption to learning while the student is on holiday or overseas
- pre-diagnosed or known illness or medical conditions
- moving house
- insufficient documentation supplied to the school with the application.

For performance-based reviews, only evidence relating to performance in 2019 and 2020 will be considered.

The selective high school will review the decision and will notify parents about the outcome.

Following the outcome of the review, if you believe you have grounds to contest the decision, you can write to the local Director, Educational Leadership.

## Transfers and repeating

Students cannot automatically transfer between selective high schools. If the student is already enrolled at one selective high school and wants to go to another, you must fill out an application

form for entry to Years 8 to 12 and lodge it directly with the selective high school you want your child to attend. The application must be submitted before the closing date each year.

If the student is currently enrolled in a selective high school and you wish your child to repeat the Year in 2021, you should discuss the matter with the current principal before applying.

## Enrolment policy

The NSW Department of Education has a responsibility to assess and manage any risk of harm to its staff or students. This includes assessing and managing risks posed to students or staff at a school by any student. Where relevant, such situations will be dealt with in accordance with the NSW Department of Education enrolment policies and procedures.

## Entry to boarder agricultural high schools

Priority for placement in boarder agricultural high schools will be given to geographically isolated students and then to other country students. Some priority will also be given to students who would have to travel extensively to study agriculture. The academic merit of boarders admitted to boarder agricultural high schools on the basis of isolation must be comparable to that of other boarders and day students at the school. For boarder placement, extra consideration may be given to students who have brothers or sisters already attending the school.

If applying for a boarder place you should complete all of the boarder agricultural school section on the application form including:

- isolation factors
- interest in agriculture
- ability to cope in a boarding situation.

In addition to satisfying residency requirements and other conditions for entry, enrolment as a boarder student is subject to the provision of a medical report for the student and the submission of a Residential student agreement.

## Boarder Students

Farrer Memorial Agricultural High School - boarder and day places for boys only. Agriculture is a compulsory subject for Years 7 to 10.



Hurlstone Agricultural High School - co-educational boarder and day places. Agriculture is a compulsory subject for Years 7 to 10.

Yanco Agricultural High School - co-educational boarder students only. Agriculture is a compulsory subject for Years 7 to 10 and is optional in senior years.

For Farrer Memorial Agricultural High School and Hurlstone Agricultural High School, a student successful in gaining a boarder placement cannot later be automatically transferred to a day place as the placement process is different for boarder and day places.

## Boarder Fees

Boarder agricultural high schools can charge an application fee, which you pay when you accept a boarder place. The school deducts that amount from the fees you pay when you enrol your child. If you withdraw your child after accepting the offer of a place, the application fee is not returned to you.

In addition to satisfying boarder requirements and other conditions for entry, you must provide a medical report and pay the boarder fee. You must confirm the 2021 boarding fees and the timing of payments with the school. You must sign a Residential student agreement undertaking to pay the boarder fees when they are due.
